Requirements have been met for the award of a QCE

Explanatory notes

The Senior Statement shows all studies, and the results achieved in those studies, that may contribute to the award of the Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE). The Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) issues the Senior Statement to eligible students who complete Year 12. The QCAA is one of the Australasian Curriculum, Assessment and Certification Authorities.

Requirements for the award of the QCE

The QCE is awarded to eligible students who have accrued the set amount of learning, at the set standard, in a set pattern, while meeting literacy and numeracy requirements.

Credits are used to measure the set amount of learning and are recorded in a student's learning account when the set standard of learning is met. Different categories and amounts of learning accrue different numbers of credits towards the QCE.

A variety of courses (contributing studies) may contribute credits towards the QCE. There are three categories of contributing studies:

- Core — usually undertaken by students during the senior phase of secondary education
- Preparatory — provide foundational learning for further education and training
- Complementary — generally go beyond the scope and/or depth of what is considered senior schooling.

To meet the requirements for the award of the QCE, an eligible student must accrue 20 credits. A minimum of 12 credits must come from completed Core courses of study. The remaining 8 credits may come from a combination of Core, Preparatory (maximum 4 credits) and Complementary courses of study. Partial completion of a Core or Complementary course of study may also contribute credits.

QCAA subjects

QCAA subjects include General, General (Extension), General (Senior External Examination), Applied and Applied (Essential) subjects and Short Courses. Depending on the syllabus type, a subject may have one, two or four units. Each subject unit has a notional teaching, learning and assessment time of 55 hours. Schools participate in QCAA assessment quality assurance processes as required.

General subjects provide courses of study consisting of four units. Unit 1 and Unit 2 results are reported as Satisfactory (S), Unsatisfactory (U) or, where appropriate, a not rated (NR). The Unit 3 and 4 pair is reported as a subject score of 0–100 and a result of A–E. General subjects may contribute up to 4 credits towards the QCE and may contribute to a student's Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR).

General (Extension) subjects provide courses of study consisting of two units (Units 3 and 4). The Unit 3 and 4 pair is reported as a subject score of 0–100 and a result of A–E. General (Extension) subjects may contribute up to 2 credits towards the QCE and may contribute to a student's ATAR.

General (Senior External Examination) subjects provide courses of study consisting of four units. Completion of a General (Senior External Examination) subject is reported as a subject score of 0–100 and a result of A–E. General (Senior External Examination) subjects may contribute up to 4 credits towards the QCE and may contribute to a student's ATAR.

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Applied subjects and Applied (Essential) subjects provide courses of study consisting of four units. Unit 1 and Unit 2 results are reported as Satisfactory (S), Unsatisfactory (U) or, where appropriate, a not rated (NR). The Unit 3 and 4 pair is reported as a result of A–E. Applied and Applied (Essential) subjects may contribute up to 4 credits towards the QCE, and a single Applied subject may contribute to a student's ATAR when combined with four General subjects.

Short Courses provide a single-unit course of study. Results are expressed as A–E. Short Courses may contribute 1 credit towards the QCE. Short Courses do not contribute to a student's ATAR.

Vocational education and training

The VET Quality Framework (VQF) provides the basis for a nationally consistent, high-quality vocational education and training (VET) system. All registered training organisations are required to comply with the VQF. Results for nationally recognised VET may appear on the Senior Statement. These results may include completed or partially completed qualifications recognised in the Australian Qualifications Framework.

Other contributing studies

Other contributing studies recognised by the QCAA may include:

- university subjects completed when enrolled at a school
- non-Queensland senior schooling studies
- recognised studies — courses of study that have been recognised by the QCAA as being eligible to contribute credit to the QCE.
